

Bardstown best lunch spot of car rally  
Wins \$5,000 for autism programs

When the Fourth Annual Hemmings Vintage Car Rally rolled through Bardstown July 28, cheerleaders, a band, balloons, lunch and plenty of supporters were around the square to greet the drivers and navigators. Their spirit has been recognized by rally organizers, who named Bardstown the best lunch spot of the rally. The two public school districts will now get the remainder of \$5,000, after lunch expenses, for their autism programs.

The rally is a fundraiser for the Autism Society of America.

The cars proceeded down West Stephen Foster Avenue, then North Third Street, stopping at the Farmers Market Pavilion. A potluck lunch was served at Bardstown United Methodist Church. There was an announcer on Court Square to share the cars' make, model and owner/navigator with the spectators. Cars include a 1933 Dodge Sedan out of Colorado, a 1917 Hudson Indy Car from Nebraska and a 1932 Ford Hiboy Roadster from North Carolina, among many others.
