
# **ABOUT US**












# LOCATION, LOCATION, LOCATION

Nelson County is centrally located within the United States providing a competitive advantage to businesses and residents that locate here. Within a four-hour drive time, the population reaches 18 million people that include major market cities such as **Nashville**, **Cincinnati**, and **Indianapolis**. The population is approximately 50 million within a six-hour drive time and includes major cities such as **Atlanta**, **St. Louis**, **Columbus**, and **Chicago**. Kentucky's borders are within a six-hour drive time of over 65 percent of the nation's population, personal income and manufacturing business establishments. Nelson County's location and accessibility allow manufacturing and logisitics businesses to reach a massive industrial and consumer market with ease and affordability.

The Louisville Muhammad Ali International Airport (SDF) is located 37 miles northwest of Bardstown. SDF offers nonstop flights to 30 destinations across the United States.

The **Blue Grass Airport** located right outside of Lexington is approximately 54 miles northeast of Bardstown. It is one of the nation's fastest growing airports and serves over 1.2 million passengers annually.

**Samuels Field** in Bardstown is owned by the City of Bardstown. It is located two miles west of Bardstown and is designed for the corporate or leisure traveler. It features a paved/lighted 5000 x 75 ft. runway with a taxiway parallel to runway. Amenities include a 24-hour self-service 100LL Avgas and Jet A fuel pumping station which accepts credit cards.

Nelson County is located right outside of the major metropolitan area of Louisville, approximately 40 miles southeast from downtown.

Half of the U.S. markets are within a one-day drive of Nelson County. Within a three hour radius, you can reach major cities such as Nashville, Cincinnati, and Indianapolis.

U.S. Route 31E runs directly through the center of Bardstown and is a thouroughfare that navigates north to Louisville and south to Nashville. I-65 runs north to south approximately 25 miles west of Bardstown.

The Martha Layne Collins Bluegrass Parkway is a major Kentucky roadway with two exit ramps in Bardstown providing tansportation from Lexington to Elizabethtown and to I-65 north and south. There are currently four Class I railroads serving Kentucky that include BNSF Railway, CSX Transportation, Norfolk Southern, and Canadian Pacific. A Class I railroad is classified as any carrier earning annual revenue greater than \$504 million.


A few regionals and short lines also serve the state. Kentucky railroads are mostly the domain of Norfolk Southern and CSX, where they operate Kentucky's east-west main lines and also control several miles of branch and secondary lines to tap coal reserves. Bardstown and Nelson County is served by the R.J Corman short rail line serving Nelson County's corporate and manufacturing clients.

In addition to corporate rail, the Old Kentucky Dinner train offers guests an experience of fine dining aboard luxurious rail cars in the heart of Kentucky Bourbon Country in a two hour round trip excursion.


#### BARDSTOWN MICROPOLITAN STATISTICAL AREA



## **BOURBON TOURISM**




